Liberty Protection Safeguards (LPS) are due to replace the Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards (DOLS) shortly, but possibly not until 1 April 2024. This one day Zoom course provides essential information on the new LPS scheme and advice on what steps can be taken now to prepare for the change. A date will be set once the final version of the Code is published and we have a definite implementation date.
